This opportunity for personal healing was meaningful to me, but what made it incredible was that Hadassah participated along with the Federation and Rabbis Tepper, Tandler and Perlstein--just as Rhonda had envisioned it.

Rhonda's efforts to bring people together for meaningful experiences were at the core of who she was. Whether the gatherings were Jewish in nature (as in her Rosh Chodesh group years ago and more recently, Hadassah) or just for fun to eat out/go to a movie, these soulful gatherings were more than just people getting together for fun.

I am reaching out to everyone reading this letter to request that, as a legacy to Rhonda, you take time to email or write each rabbi, Hadassah and Jewish Federation and request that this type of joint service/program happen at least twice a year. What better tribute could there be for Rhonda?

Travel to Israel: Passport and Visa Information

You will need a signed US Passport for travel to Israel, valid for at least 6 months after the return date to the U.S. Carry it with you! Do not pack it in your luggage. Consult your local US Passport office if you have any questions about the validity of your passport or if you must renew your current one. If you are not a US citizen, please contact the Israeli Consulate for the most up to date entry requirements.

US citizens need not apply for a visa before leaving for Israel: they will be given this visa upon their arrival in Israel free of charge.

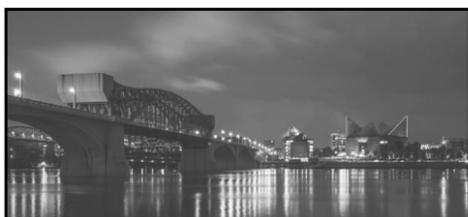
Make It & Bake It: A Young Adult and Family Cooking Club

Your Purim To-Do List

1) Listen to the Megillah



To relive the miraculous events of Purim, listen to the reading of the Gantse Megillah (entire book of Esther). And not just once but twice: Saturday night, March 15, and again on Purim day, March 16. Tell the children that Purim is the only time when it's a mitzvah to make noise! And don't forget to stamp out Hamans' name.

2) Give to the needy (*Matanot La'Evyoni*)

Concern for the needy is a year-round responsibility, but on Purim it is a special mitzvah to remember the poor. Give charity to at least two (but preferably more) needy individuals on Purim day, March 16.



3) Send food portions to friends (*Mishloach Manot*)

On Purim we emphasize the importance of Jewish unity and friendship by sending gifts of food to friends. On Purim day, March 16, send a gift of at least two kinds of ready-to-eat foods (e.g., pastry, fruit, beverage) to at least one friend.

4) Eat, Drink and Be Merry

Purim should be celebrated with a special festive meal on Purim day, at which family and friends gather together to rejoice in the Purim spirit. It is a mitzvah to drink wine or other inebriating drinks at this meal. (Enough to believe you are really in Mexico at this years "Purim in Mexico!")



Purim Customs: Masquerades and Hamantashen

It is customary for children to dress up and disguise themselves (a Mexican theme will make you fit right in) — an allusion to the fact that the miracle of Purim was disguised in natural garments. This is also the significance behind a traditional Purim food, the *hamantash*—a pastry whose filling is hidden within a three-cornered crust.



Where can you paint your own maracas, chow down on tacos and fajitas, parade around in costumes and hear music from a live five-member Mariachi band?

If you guessed a Cinco De Mayo celebration, try again.

These events will all be part of a Mexican Purim Fiesta!

Every year we celebrate a different country and this year the Purim Fiesta promises to be *extraordinario!*

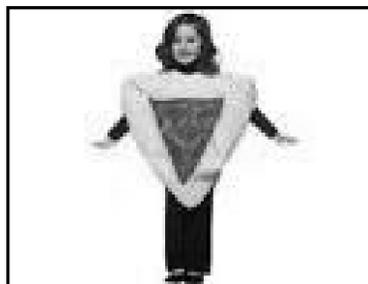
