

The blessing reads as follows:

'We will return to you [Chattanooga Jewish Congregational Religious School], and you will return to us. Our mind is on you [Chattanooga Jewish Congregational Religious School], and your mind is on us. We will not forget you [Chattanooga Jewish Congregational Religious School] and you will not forget us – not in this world and not in the world to come.'

"While it might seem that we should just put down our book and move on to the next one, we actually take a moment to express our affection for the text with which we just built a relationship."

This blessing is a perfect way to wrap up the year.



One rule of Temple or Synagogue life that never changes is that you only get something out of Jewish life when you put something – yourself - in.

In 2016, we anticipate a celebration befitting all that we bring to our city while rejoicing in Mizpah's first 150 years of life in Chattanooga. Let's be partners and offer the best of ourselves toward sustaining all that is engaging, welcoming, compassionate and forward-thinking about Mizpah Congregation. There's much to be excited about. To borrow from the closing words of each of the Five Books of Moses, "hazak, hazak v'nithazek ... strong, strong and we shall be strong."
